# **Outgoing Chairman's Report**

2023/24 has been a busy year for our council.

The youth club has now been up and running for over a year now and is being supervised and organised by Action for Children. It appears that this is popular with the younger children but not so much with the older ones. The junior netball project has also come out from the initial engagement with the young people and is very well attended with sessions being held at Cornwall College in Pool and open to the wider area – not just Portreath. We have held weekly "Warm Welcome" sessions throughout the year with monthly guest speakers, bingo and a general chance for a coffee, cake, and chat. Unfortunately, the numbers of people attending have dwindled and these have suspended these for now.

The Remembrance parade and service was organised back in November and was very well attended.

The council had entered into an option agreement with a developer to investigate the possibility of building 100% affordable homes on the former WAAF site which would be managed by Coastline Housing if built. Whilst we were aware of how important affordable housing is from the NDP and from talking to residents, I think it's fair to say that the council were surprised by the amount of opposition to this scheme that arose regarding this. It is presently in the hands of the planning authority for a final decision after the planning application was lodged by the developers in February. This process had insured the ability for members of the public to comments on the proposed scheme.

The biggest project undertaken is the redevelopment of the old redundant toilet block to build a parish office and meeting room in its place. We applied for funding from the CLUP fund administered by Cornwall Council, which was a huge administrative task that took many, many

hours of work from the working group of the parish council. In the end it was worth it, and the necessary funding was awarded. The work has actually commenced with the demolition



complete and construction underway. We envisage completion in the Autumn. I have now handed the over the reins to the new Chairman Cllr Goodwin with Cllr Nash as his Vice Chairman, I wish them the best of luck with their new roles within the council. I would like to take this opportunity to thank councillors and officers for their support over the past four years and am looking forward to seeing the completion of our major projects before this term of council is up!

# **Parish Office and Community Hub**

April finally saw spades hit the ground for the start the of the project to demolish for former public toilets and replace with a purpose-built office and community hub.



Councillors have been working on this project for a number of years, but it has finally come to fruition with help from Cornwall Council's Community Capacity Fund which funded some of the costs for the surveys and structural design allowing councillors to bring the project together and successfully apply for funding from Cornwall Council's Community Levelling up

Programme. Securing the grant for £198,605.57 from the UK Government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund enable the start of the much-needed office and community hub.

The new building to be opened in early 2025 will provide the Parish Council with an office, as well as having a small community meeting room. It will also be a place to celebrate and promote Portreath Parish Heritage and local Tourism to visitors. The building will be repositioned in line with other buildings to allow the public footpath to be widened in the process so that it is fully accessible and safer for pedestrians.

# Community Speed Watch – Illogan and Portreath

The group began on the 22 November 2022 and

currently has 14 volunteers recorded. To date, the group has run 14 sessions. The group covers sites in Portreath and Illogan,

which have been identified as 'problem speeding areas'.

Portreath Parish Council invested in a 'Speeding Sign', which moves between the bottom of Tolticken Hill and Bridge Moor, which is and will remain to be a 30mph limit (Bridge itself is changing to 20mph). This sign has shown some concerning statistics, with motorists speeding along this stretch, some have reached speeds in excess of 80mph – in a 30mph zone!! Since the group started, 97 vehicles have been recorded as being over the speed limit, with a maximum speed of 51mph, in a 30mph area. Due to this project, we have seen an increase of Traffic Police in the area.

We would like to deliver more sessions; however, this is dependent on Volunteer time, availability, and the Cornish weather! If you are interested in volunteering for this local project, please contact Cllr Dave Crabtree or Cllr Vicki Webb

Overall, the community would like PPC to gain ownership of the land, as long as it doesn't cost anything. Through



conversations with parishioners and feedback on the Survey form, many felt that the offer on the table was far too expensive and not in the best interests of the parish. The next step is for a conversation between Cornwall Council and PPC, to negotiate a better offer, with the aim for the land to be gifted or received it for a nominal amount (£1 + legal fees). We will keep you updated as soon as we are able!

# **Youth Engagement**

As a result, we were able to create a partnership with Action for Children, who had the capacity to deliver Youth Nights in the village EVERY MONDAY night. We also created a Youth Action Plan. You may not know, but there is a Youth Working Group! This Working Group consists of Youth Workers from Action for Children, councillors and until recently, a PIC member (we are hoping for a representative to join us soon). If there are any members of the public, who has

The Youth Nights times have changed recently, to adapt to the way the young people use the space and to incorporate working with young people who are home schooled. Please encourage your young people to use these nights and help to spread the word!

# **Community Junior Netball**

As many may remember, Portreath Parish Council (PPC) delivered some sport Taster Sessions in the village. One of which was Netball and was kindly hosted by Portreath Primary School and 3 local parishioners who delivered the sessions! The netball sessions evolved into Community Junior Netball sessions, as a need was identified and a gap in delivery in this area for the sport.



PPC has created some amazing partnerships with Portreath Primary School, Netball Cornwall and Lastonets Netball Club, in order to take this opportunity further. We were successful in gaining funding through the Community Chest, supported by Cllr Dave Crabtree and our Community Link Officer.

Overall, we reached 42 Young People and recruited 8 new Volunteers. The feedback that we have received from both young people and volunteers has been incredibly

positive. Our volunteers have now teamed up with Lastonets Netball Club, and formed a junior committee, in the hope that funding can be secured to take this forward. Portreath Parish Council wishes the committee well with taking this project to the next step of it journey.

#### **A Tribute**

The sad news of the passing of former Councillor Patrick Kessel was heard by councillors and the community in February 2024. At their March meeting councillors held a minute's silence as a mark of respect. Patrick was only a councillor for a short time but during his time on the council he made a massive impact. His determination and drive led the council to instigate many projects including exploring the use of the former WAAF Site as social housing, for local people. The community he loved and the people in it were always at the heart of his ideas, decisions, and actions. Patrick served many years as a member of the Portreath Improvements Committee a number of those as Chairman. He supported their work by dedicating much of his time to ensuring smooth running of the beach car park. We know many members of the community have their own memories of Patrick quietly helping out where help was needed.

The thoughts of councillors and officers remain with Patrick's family, friends, colleagues at the Portreath Improvements Committee and the wider community. A man who will truly be missed by so many.

# A new .gov.uk Domain

In a bid to continue to progress with the increased professionality of the council, members resolved to adopt a .gov.uk domain for the council's website and individual email addresses for each officer and councillor. #### **Grants & Donations**

Donations totalling £1242.00 were given in 23/24, including donations to the Portreath Preschool, Illogan Sparnon Silver band and the Poppy Appeal.

Portreath Parish Council has a budget allocated for a range of grants for local organisations. For further details see our website for the Grant policy and application form. We ask that any applications for large grants are with the council no later than October for consideration with the 25/26 budget.

# **Finance & Budget**

The council is pleased to report that the Parish balanced its books for the year 2023/24. To prepare for 2024/25 budget setting the Council held community engagement sessions asking parishioners how they wanted their money to be spent. Unfortunately, these weren't well supported by parishioners, which is a real shame. Councillors welcome input from parishioners especially when it comes to how the council administers it finances. Watch out for budgeting workshops in later in the year when the council will start to look ahead to 25/26 budget! In summary the planned spend for 2024/25 is £102,932.00 reserves of £50,697.00. The increase in the precept to cover the planned expenditure has resulted in an overall increase of 17.02%, which reflects a percentage increase to the average Council taxpayer of 13.96% or 35p per week increase. The full budget

document is available on our website. The cost of the parish office and community hub has been funded from Cornwall Council's Community Levelling up Programme, meaning that the cost of this project is not being covered by parishioners in Portreath. This funding is ring fended for the project and cannot be used to fund other parish council work or projects. The Community Levelling Up Programme is part of the Good Growth Programme, which is delivering the UK Shared Prosperity Fund in Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly. Portreath Parish Council received £198,605.57 from the UK Government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund.

#### **BOPP**

With more than 30% of the councils' budgets being spent on maintaining the public toilets councillors have discussed at length



the idea of charging for the public toilets, however have never committed to this as they are aware that parishioners already contribute towards their up keep when paying their council tax.

Councillors have considered donation boxes but concluded that the cost of administering them would likely outweigh the donations received, especially when people are generally using less cash! For the last year we have been using BOPP a donation platform where members of the public can scan a QR code to make a donation to the running of the public toilets. During 23/24 the council received

donations totalling £194.50. This is equivalent to the electricity used over 5 months of the year!
