Following the deferral of the vote due to the pre-election period at the June meeting of the council parishioners have requested the council ***considers resolving to take a vote of no confidence in South West Water's performance and future ability to manage our sewer systems in line with their legal obligations.***

## CLERKS REPORT June 2024

**24154 To resolve to take a vote of no confidence in South West Water**, authorise any action and consider associated expenditure Councillors noted the request from parishioners to take a vote of no confidence in South West Water.

The meeting noted the comments from CC Crabtree's earlier report.

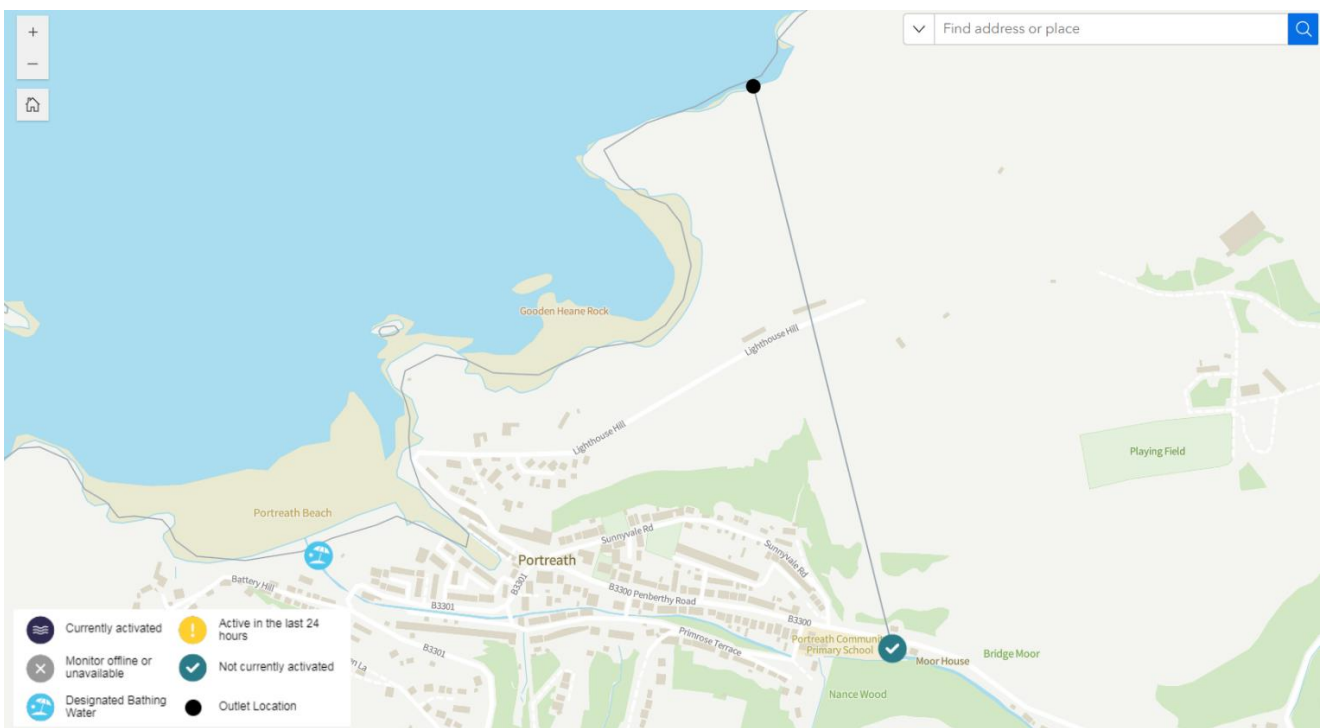
The Clerk advised against making the resolution at present due to being in the election pre-election period and suggested that the vote be deferred until after the general election.

The meeting debated the issue, with members of the public present expressing their extreme disappointment that the council may agree to defer the decision until after the general election.

Following heated debate Cllr Jarman proposed Members of Portreath Parish Council resolve to Declare that it has no confidence in South West Water's existing systems and processes for proactively managing and investing in Cornwall specifically Portreath's sewage infrastructure. There was no second to this proposal, Cllr Stewart made a counter proposal that Members of Portreath Parish Council resolve to defer the vote of no confidence in South West Water until after the general election scheduled for the 4th July. This motion was seconded by Cllr. Parker put to the meeting and carried with 4 votes in favour.

The Chairman has prepared a briefing for councillor prior to their discussion.

Sgt F J Schmelz RCAF + Crashed 1630 in the sea off Fowey on the S  
Sgt J F Clark + coast of Cornwall. Two bodies were recovered  
Sgt F E Thompson + and taken for burial; Sgt Schmelz RCAF, an  
Sgt G F Waters + American from Reading, Pennsylvania, rests  
Sgt F Cunningham + in Illogan (St. Illogan) Churchyard, Camborne-  
Sgt G B Amery + Redruth, while Sgt Clark is interred at Plymouth  
(Efford) Cemetery. The others are commemorated  
on the Runnymede Memorial. It is noted that Sgt Waters hailed from Portreath  
and perhaps caught a brief glimpse of his home on Cornwall's north coast, away  
to the NW from where his aircraft went into the water.

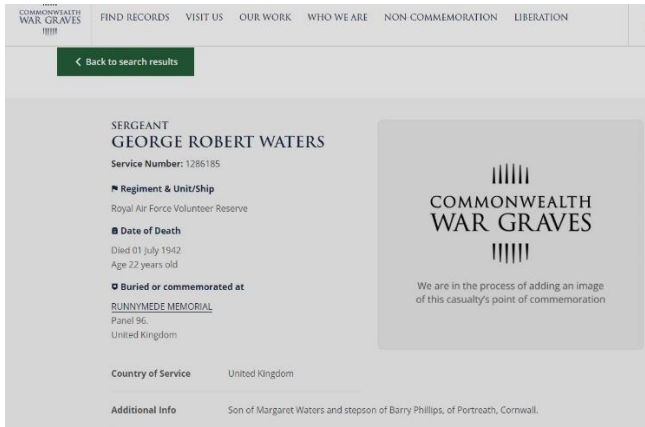
