



Program Overview

- **Program Name:** 4YOUTH outreach report
- **Date:** July 25th July 2026 – 13:30-14:35
- **Location:** Portreath Village
- **Target Group:** Young people who are in the village at time of the visit.

The primary goal of this outreach initiative is to try and reduce anti-social behaviour in the village and sources ideas regarding what can be offered to engage young people. Also to encourage community awareness.

Key Achievements and Outcomes

- **Total Number of Participants:** 15 young people
- **Gender :** 11 boys 4 girls
- **Demographic :** Portreath, Redruth, Camborne and London and Troon.
- **Ages :** Between the aged of 13 and 17

During the detached youth work session in the village, we engaged with a number of young people and took the opportunity to speak with them about the upcoming summer activities, including Chips and Chill The young people showed a positive interest in both opportunities and were receptive to the information provided. We encouraged them to get involved and explained how the activities could provide a safe, positive and enjoyable environment for them to spend time with their peers during the summer.

We also used the session as an opportunity to provide informal advice and guidance around harbour safety, particularly in relation to tide times, jumping from the harbour and the potential risks associated with the area. We discussed the importance of being aware of changing tide



conditions, identifying hazards and making safer choices when spending time around the harbour. We pointed out specific hazards within the area and encouraged young people to consider their own safety as well as the safety of others.

It was particularly lovely to reconnect with several young people we had met during the previous summer. This provided an opportunity to strengthen existing relationships and continue building trust with young people within the local community. The young people were respectful and engaging throughout our conversations, and we had some really positive interactions. These informal conversations are valuable in helping us understand what is important to young people locally and ensuring that our outreach work remains responsive to their needs and interests.

The overall session was positive and productive. We were able to engage with young people in a relaxed environment, promote upcoming opportunities and provide appropriate safety advice. We did not witness any anti-social behaviour during the session, and the young people we engaged with responded positively to our presence and conversations.

Overall, the session demonstrated the value of continued detached youth work within the harbour area, allowing 4YOUTH to maintain positive relationships with young people, promote safe behaviours and provide information about opportunities available to them within the local community.
