

## **Report from the Police Liaison Group (PLG) Volunteer – Vicki Webb**

The PLG meeting was held on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> February 2023.

The meeting was chaired by Wayne Hick.

Sophie Curtis will be returning in June/July from her secondment.

Wayne Hick reported that they had recently held a Neighbourhood Action Week:

- Chief Constable came to visit Camborne
- Key Message was that he would like to see Police more visible within the community
- More streamlined service to reduce bureaucracy
- PCSO's will now be issued with laptops, so they can do their paperwork when out n about, rather than being in the police station
- Senior Leaders – Chief Superintendent have also visited
- Training for officers – Community Protection Warnings – which are more effective

Camborne: Reports on ASB, associated with drugs and alcohol. Police are patrolling areas and being visible.

Pool: Vehicle crime had increased. 2 arrests were made. Currently collecting evidence for the court case.

Redruth: Halifax has now closed, which had been problematic due to free Wi-Fi. Kids are now hanging around the train station, for the free Wi-Fi. Police have been working with the Station & Transport Police as ASB has increased in this area. Also, concerns around County Lines, bringing drugs on the trains which heightens the risk. Police and Transport Police are working together to target this crime as it is viewed as a considerable risk to the community.

Parishes: No current issues from Police, and none were raised in the meeting.

AOB: PC Jason Rowe will be retiring in June, however due to the amount of Annual Leave owed, he will leave in April. Replacement has been recruited.
