**Louisa Brown – New Inspector for Camborne – 19 years in police force.**

**January – New Programme – Right Care; Right Person – Being rolled out now over next few years in Cornwall, working in partnership with other agencies. This is to ensure that the Police are supporting people in the right way. PLUS:**

- Neighbourhood Policing Focus – Public Service; Courage and Empathy.
- New Code of Ethics for the Police
- Engaging with local schools & businesses – Positive Neighbourhood policing
- Street Marshalls in Camborne – to compliment not to replace police
- Missing People – A lot of work going on in this area especially around young people

Shooting in Redruth 2023 – Verdict Guilty

### **Guest Speaker: Alan Reed, Community Speed Watch Officer**

Alan advised that he helps to set up and support CSW in Cornwall. The overall aim is to reduce RTAs and Speed.

This is all dealt with via their on-line Community Speed Watch website. The data is used to understand where the most dangerous areas are, and can highlight when Alan may work alongside a CSW group, to ticket speeding motorists on the spot, rather than them just

**Q: Can we carry out CSW during the 20mph Roll Out?** TROs should be in place and will need receiving a letter. Some bedding in time is required. It will be enforceable now. For the trial places of 20mph, they didn't do any speed checks for 3-4months, however, as it has been widely publicised and communities know it is on its way, he expects the bedding in time to be much less, at perhaps 1 month, but this is to be confirmed.

**Q: What happens to the people who are abusive to CSW volunteers?** Alan advised that they are sent a letter, however, depending on type of abuse, some may receive a doorstep visit. CSW volunteers, will be advised.

**Q: How can we recruit more volunteers?** It was recognised that finding volunteers is difficult and many CSW have folded, due to low numbers of volunteers. No solution was given, other than all the benefits that a CSW in an area can have and the feel-good factor, of having helped to reduce the speeds on our roads.

### **Guest Speaker – Ollie Bayliss – Community Safety Officer**

Ollie told us about the funding 'Safer Streets Grant – Round 5', which has recently been awarded to Camborne and Redruth – Approx. £364K

The main areas to improve, include: Tackling Violence against Women & Girls & Neighbourhood ASB. This needs to be delivered by 1 April 2025.

- New Street Lighting and improved CCTV in Redruth and Camborne.
- Dedicated ASB Case Worker
- Street Marshalls in Camborne
- Prevention Work – Healthy Partnerships; Bystander Intervention Training; Dedicated YP Substance Misuse Worker; Identified areas for CCTV in Redruth and Camborne.
