Youth Consultation:

Taster Session Update:

We have held 2 taster sessions in April, Table Tennis and Band Session.

Table Tennis - Unfortunately, only 2 young people attended the Table Tennis. This could be that it was held in half term. Band Session – No young people attended this. We had 5 young people who had expressed an interest in this. However, some were ill and some had just returned from holidays. We believe it was just bad timing. Cllr Tull and Cllr Webb will arrange to get the young people together with their parents, to see if they would like this to be taken forward. It maybe that we aim for this to happen in Autumn/Winter. The band were really understanding. Thank you to Rob Aggett for giving up his time.

May Taster Session

Tag Rugby – This taster session was delivered at low tide on Portreath Beach on Thursday 11th May, by JP from Redruth Rugby Club. JP is a trained coach for the club and they delivered this as part of their commitment to delivering Rugby in local communities. At the time of writing this report, we had 3 consent forms completed and 5 enquires for consent forms to be sent. Lucy will be able to give an update at the meeting.

Youth Night - Launch Event - MONDAY 19[™] JUNE

With the help of the youth workers, we will be inviting 5 young people who have expressed an interest in being on a youth panel, to help to plan the launch of the youth nights! We hope that they will help to design the poster and to plan the first session!

Dog Fouling Campaign

After the success of the first Campaign on Penberthy Road and the Harbour area, we have begun to monitor 2 other identified hot spot areas: Entrance to Tramway (Portreath) and Jubilee Gardens. PIC were contacted for permission to site these on Jubilee Gardens.

At the time of writing this report, during the '2 week pre-count' to monitor the areas, neither has had much dog fouling, in comparison to the areas chosen for Campaign#1. Therefore, we may well begin a pre-count in 2 other identified hot spot areas. This will delay Campaign#2 but it would be best to put the signs where they are most needed and will have the most impact.

Thank you to Cllr Mark Hitchen, for offering to arrange 3 x MDF pieces to be cut. The 'We are Watching You' signs will be attached to these. This will hopefully ensure that the signs will last longer and can be re-used for future campaigns.

Proposal: Would the Parish Council support in principle, the commitment to providing & funding one dispenser and biodegradable poo bags as a trial, on/near the beach area. The Parish Council would need to investigate dispensers, poo bags, where it would be sited, plus gain the necessary permissions. See example below.



This photo demonstrates the type of dispenser suggested, but there will be other designs that would be investigated, to be considered by the council.

As an example, the above design costs £79.00 + VAT = £94.80. This is from JRB Enterprise, who are a British Company, whose tag line is 'The Dog & Litter Pollution Solution'

If agreed, we could tie this in with a Dog Fouling Campaign around the beach area, to help raise awareness and to encourage all dog owners/walkers to pick up their dog mess.

Warm Welcome Portreath

The warm welcome continues to take place, every Thursday 10am – 12noon at St Marys Church. The Council agreed for this to continue in Term Time, while it is being used by members of our community.

The Parish Councillors have set up a Rota for this. If anyone would like to volunteer, please let either Lucy or myself know. It would be appreciated and would only require 2 hrs a month.

Lelant Garden Centre Outing

The Council agreed to the waiver form and to cover the costs for a mini bus to take those who attend the coffee morning to Lelant Garden Centre at the March Parish Meeting.

This outing has now been arranged for Thursday 15th June. Ian Stewart has visited the site and carried out an initial Risk Assessment, a more official Risk Assessment will need to be completed prior to the trip.

We have booked the Age Concern UK minibus and have been allocated with a volunteer driver. The bus will leave St Marys Church at 10.30 and will arrive back at approximately 14.30. Gill and Ian are on the rota for this outing.

A poster has been designed and it will hopefully be advertised at the 11th May Coffee Morning onwards. Those interested will be given waiver forms to take home to complete. We hope that we have enough people interested in attending this outing. Deadline will be Thursday 8th June for bookings.
