I am forwarding this to all relevant parties because I believe this is a significant public safety issue rather than simply a parking complaint. The vehicles shown are examples of a recurring problem that regularly forces road users into conflict on a blind bend.

In my view, it is only a matter of time before a serious or potentially fatal collision occurs if this continues unchecked. I would therefore be grateful if this matter could be treated as a road safety concern and if the appropriate authority could confirm what action will now be taken.

**Subject:** Urgent Road Safety Concern – Dangerous Illegal Parking on Battery Hill / Tregay Hill, Portreath

Dear Highways and Parking Enforcement Team,

I am writing as a resident of Portreath to report an ongoing and extremely serious road safety issue on Battery Hill / Tregay Hill, the road leading out of Portreath towards Godrevy.

Vehicles are repeatedly parking on double yellow lines on the blind uphill bend. This is not an occasional occurrence; it happens regularly and has become normalised.

The issue goes far beyond a parking inconvenience. Vehicles travelling in opposite directions are being forced into the same section of road on a blind corner, creating a significant risk of a head-on collision. The danger is particularly severe for

motorcyclists and cyclists, who frequently use this route and may have little or no opportunity to avoid a collision when confronted with an obstruction around the bend.

As a local resident who uses this road frequently, I have personally witnessed numerous near misses and dangerous situations. In my view it is only a matter of time before somebody is seriously injured or killed if effective action is not taken.

Attached are seven photographs taken on 24 June 2026 at approximately 18:40 showing vehicles parked on the double yellow lines. I have also attached a map screenshot with the location clearly marked and highlighted for reference.

I would be grateful if you could confirm:

1.

Whether the attached vehicles will be investigated for enforcement action.

2.

What enforcement measures are currently being undertaken at this location.

3.

Whether additional enforcement patrols can be arranged.

4.

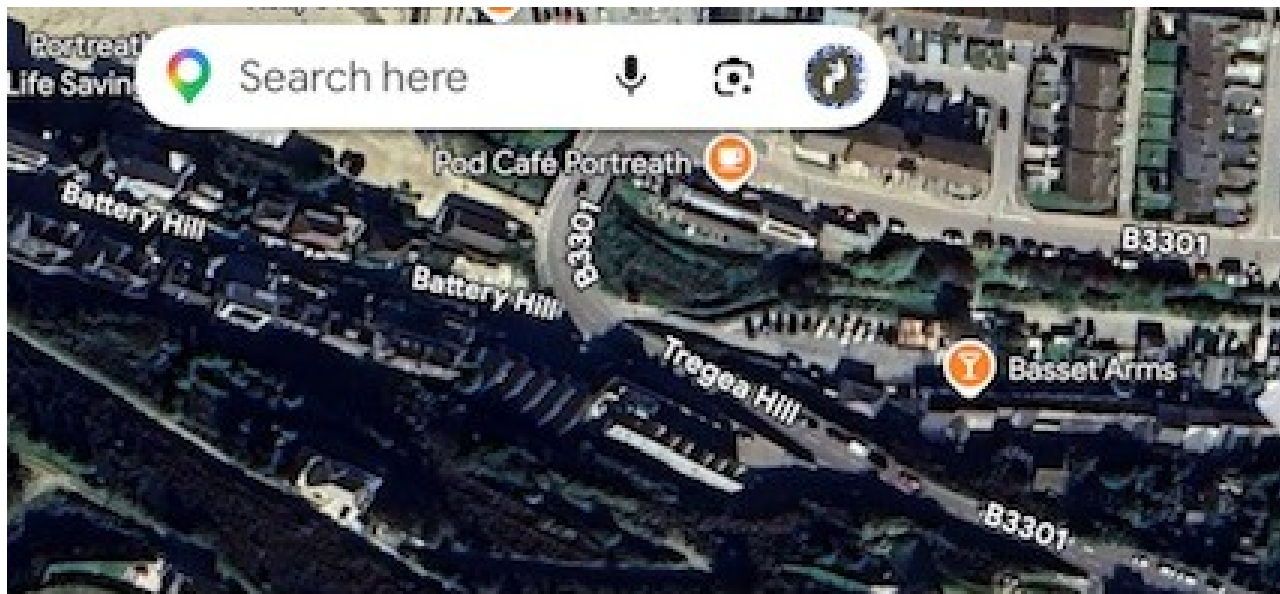
Whether the Council will consider longer-term measures such as CCTV enforcement, physical deterrents, bollards, additional restrictions or other road safety interventions.

5.

Whether a formal road safety assessment can be carried out at this location.

Given the ongoing nature of the problem and the clear risk to public safety, I would appreciate a written response outlining what action will be taken, which department will take ownership of this issue, and the expected timescale.
