The Council's reason for refusing permission for this development is set out below:

The proposed development would result in a large self-contained unit of living accommodation which, given its excessive scale, degree of self-containment, and lack of functional link with the main dwelling, would be tantamount to a new dwelling in the open countryside without any special justification therefore failing to represent a genuine ancillary development. The proposal is therefore contrary to the aims and intentions of policy 1 of the Portreath Neighbourhood Development Plan, policies 1, 2, 7 and 12 of the Cornwall Local Plan Strategic Policies 2010 - 2030, paragraphs 8 , 11 and 135 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2024 and policies C1 and T1 of the Cornwall Council Climate Emergency Development Document.
